Prospective Campers

Participants in youth football through grade 12 are eligible. Graduating 2008 seniors are eligible to attend camp. Early application is advised.

Housing & Food

The residence halls are within walking distance of the Williams Center complex and the football fields. Resident campers will be housed two to a room. The dining halls are located in close proximity to the residence halls and serve three well-balanced meals daily to resident campers. Commuter campers in all camps will be entitled to lunch and dinner. These meals are included in the camp fee.

Insurance

Each camper will be covered by a group accident insurance policy. The cost of insurance is included in the registration fee. The insurance includes primary coverage up to \$1,000, secondary coverage up to \$5,000, and \$300 maximum dental insurance. (Insurance does not cover pre-existing injuries and is for accidents only.) Every precaution will be taken to prevent accidents. The Warhawk Football Camps will have a camp health supervisor available.

Registration

Final registration/check-in will be held on Sunday morning of each camp from 11:30 a.m.-12:30 p.m. *with lunch on your own.* About 2-3 weeks prior to the start of each camp, specific instructions for reporting to camp will be sent to participants, as well as a list of what to bring and the residence hall assignment.

Camp Fees

The camp fee for Specialized Passing will be \$300 for resident campers and \$270 for commuters. The Youth Camp will be \$285 for resident campers and \$255 for commuters. The O-Line & D-Line Camp will be \$250 for residents and \$220 for commuters. The fee for all camps includes a \$100 non-refundable deposit. Fee includes meals, lodging, insurance, instructional materials and camp t-shirt.

Specialized Passing Camp

JUNE 15-18

RECOMMENDED FOR GRADES 9-12

The Specialized Passing Camp will provide instruction for quarterbacks, backs, tight ends and wide receivers, as well as defensive backs, linebackers and defensive ends. Concentration will be on the passing game (drop back, sprint, roll-out, play action passes and screens). Also, there will be emphasis on the offensive and defensive running game skills, both individually and in small work groups. There will be instruction on reading secondary coverages and how to attack them.

Youth Football Camp

RECOMMENDED FOR GRADES 4-8

The Youth Football Camp has been a very productive camp for young men just learning the skills needed to participate in football. It is basically for learning techniques, and focuses on instruction for all positions. Each camper will have equal offensive and defensive practice sessions to give them equal exposure to both sides. The emphasis will be on basic fundamentals. Young men just starting their football training are encouraged to attend this camp.

O-Line & D-Line Camp

JULY 9-11

RECOMMENDED FOR GRADES 7-12

The O-Line & D-Line Camp is designed to develop skills and techniques of players who work in the trenches of their teams. Intensive individual coaching, as well as group work, will assist in helping players to develop not only the techniques necessary to play, but also the development on each player's confidence. This camp is padded and will be open to offensive linemen (including the center, guards, tackles, and tight ends) and defensive linemen (including the noseguards, tackles, ends, and stand up linebackers that play the line). Campers will be grouped by grade, age and experience.

The camp philosophy is to provide solid fundamental football skills in a relaxed atmosphere. We will teach techniques that are vital to the athlete in reaching his fullest potential. There will also be instruction in weight training, running techniques, flexibility exercises and special skills.

Camp Staff

The 2007 Division III National Coach of the Year, Lance Leipold and his Championship staff at UW-Whitewater will lead a camp staff consisting of dedicated coaches from high school and collegiate levels to help campers learn and develop new skills needed to be successful in this great sport of football. This is our 33rd year and we have the reputation of being among the finest technique camps in the Midwest.

Focus of Instruction

Each camper may specialize and choose particular techniques he wishes to learn in the following areas:

- **THE QUARTERBACK**
Ball Handling, Passing, Field Generalship & Strategy
- **THE RUNNING BACK**
Ball Carrying, Faking, Blocking, and Pass Receiving
- **THE DEFENSIVE BACK**
Tackling, Keying, Pass Defense (Man for Man & Zone)
- **THE ENDS & FLANKERS**
Releases, Patterns, Receiving, Ball Carrying & Blocking
- **THE OFFENSIVE LINEMAN**
Stance, Explosion, Pulling, Trapping, & Blocking (Pass Protection, Scramble, Reach, & Double Team)
- **THE DEFENSIVE LINEMAN**
Stance, Reading Reaction, Slant Techniques, Pass Rushing, & Tackling
- **THE LINEBACKER**
Stance, Keying, Reaction, Tackling & Pass Defense
- **THE DEFENSIVE END**
Stance, Techniques, Playing the Opposition, Pass Rush & Contain

Every camper will be instructed in quickness and agility drills, flexibility, and proper running technique.



UW-Whitewater Facilities

Facilities for all summer camps are among the finest in the country. The main hub of activity for the football camps will be the Williams Center Physical Education Center, the David L. Kachel/DLK Fieldhouse and surrounding fields. The center has a swimming pool, 3 gymnasiums, 4 handball/racketball courts, 60,000 sq. ft. fieldhouse and a 12,000 sq. ft. weight room.

Equipment

Warhawk Football Camps are part of a select group of camps that use helmets and shoulder pads. Our camps will offer the use of shoulder pads and helmets. No scrimmage will be allowed without shoulder pads and helmets. We will furnish helmets and shoulder pads if needed.

Check with your state high school activities association concerning their rule on equipment. Some states limit you to the use of head gear only and some will not allow the use of any equipment. Some states do not allow the use of equipment belonging to a high school.

Note

Participants will not be allowed to practice with eyeglasses on unless they are unbreakable. This is in accordance with NCAA rules as well as most states' activities associations.
